The powerful academic program and community standards at AFS are guided by the Quaker belief that every student in our care is gifted with remarkable potential. Our students seek intellectual adventure, build strong analytical and creative thinking skills and form a sturdy sense of self.

Total enrollment (600) is divided among Early Childhood (3 year-old-4 year-old, 45) Lower School (K - 4, 129), Middle School (5 - 8, 154), and Upper School (9 - 12, 272).

Students are expected to go beyond minimum requirements in their areas of concentration. All students are expected to pass the equivalent of five courses each semester, with at least four core academic courses (English, history, Java, language, math, philosophy, science, and advanced art). Students who schedule more than six courses in a semester must have their rosters reviewed and approved by the Director of Studies.

Qualified students may arrange for an independent study course, not, however, to fulfill core requirements. If deemed necessary and appropriate, it may be recommended by the Director of Studies, the Upper School Director and the corresponding department chair that a student take one course on a pass/fail basis. In order to receive a grade of pass, the student must achieve a C- or higher.
