The powerful academic program and community standards at AFS are guided by the Quaker belief that every student in our care is gifted with remarkable potential. Our students seek intellectual adventure, build strong analytical and creative thinking skills and form a sturdy sense of self.

Total enrollment (630) is divided among Early Childhood (3 year-old-4 year-old, 39) Lower School (K - 4, 140), Middle School (5 - 8, 159), and Upper School (9 - 12, 292).

#### **ACADEMIC REQUIREMENTS**

- 4 years of English
- 3 years of history
- 3 years of mathematics
- 3 years of the same world language
- 3 years of laboratory science
- 3 courses in the visual and performing arts
- 1 course in 9th and 12th grade of health
- 1 course of 10th Grade Seminar
- 1 course of 11th College Guidance Seminar
- 3 courses of Experiential Learning (ExTerm or Global Travel)

Students are expected to go beyond minimum requirements in their areas of concentration. All students are expected to pass the equivalent of five courses each semester, with at least four core academic courses (English, history, math/computer science, world language, science, and art). Students are allowed to enroll in a maximum of seven classes each semester.

Qualified students may arrange for an independent study course, not, however, to fulfill core requirements. If deemed necessary and appropriate, it may be recommended by the Director of Studies, the Upper School Director and the corresponding department chair that a student take one course on a pass/fail basis. In order to receive a grade of pass, the student must achieve a C- or higher.

#### **RANK IN CLASS**

Abington Friends School does not determine or report class rank. Students' cumulative grade-point averages appear on their end-of-year reports and on their transcripts in June. All courses are college preparatory. Pass-fail courses do not affect a student's GPA.

AFS' student population reflects the racial and socioeconomic diversity of the greater Philadelphia area. 53% of AFS students self-identify as students of color, and students attending AFS come from over 78 different local zip codes.
